

DAY OF AI IN 2024

In 2024, Day of Al's central, United States-based team reached over 400,000 students and teachers globally. Additionally, our accessible resources catalyzed international initiatives in Vietnam, the Philippines, India, the UAE, Latin America, and Australia, impacting another 270,000+ students and 15,000 educators.

Day of Al's USA team also expanded our professional development workshops. Our in-person and virtual workshops help educators worldwide responsibly integrate Al into their teaching and learning, empowering communities to understand and address Al's implications for their schools. We are grateful to the community of educators, students, staff, researchers, and supporters who helped make this transformative work possible.

RECRUITMENT & PARTICIPATION

The Day of AI program is actively promoted through various channels, including social media, professional educator networks, and government-led initiatives. We engage individual educators as well as regional leaders to teach Day of AI lessons in their classrooms or launch initiatives. We especially welcome educators without any background in STEM subjects or expertise in computer science, to help ensure that AI literacy is accessible to everyone.

Based on self-reported data, we estimate that **Day of AI reached over 670,000 students worldwide in 2024.** Although this figure only approximates our impact, we're excited to continue seeing our program's exponential growth through every year of its existence. This year alone, more than 5,000 new teachers from all 50 states in the U.S. registered for Day of AI on our website. Internationally, educators from India, Poland, and Canada constituted the largest groups among the over 170 countries that have accessed our resources. 








INTERNATIONAL USER MAP


MASSACHUSETTS SUMMIT



CURRICULUM

The Day of Al curricula, created in collaboration with MIT RAISE, features hands-on activities promote critical thinking, multidisciplinary exploration, and responsible Al use. All activities are free to use, adapt, and share under a Creative Commons -BY-NC-SA license.

Modules are available for lower elementary (ages 4-7), upper elementary (ages 8-10), middle school (ages 11-13), and high school tracks (ages 14-18). Each module includes 4 to 8 hours of curriculum with online and unplugged activities in 30-45 minute blocks.

Developed with Yarn Media, engages young learners in hands-on lessons about Al's role in the creative process.




Introduces basic data science literacy through the lens of human senses and climate change.

On May 13, 2024, we held our third annual Day of Al event at the Museum of Science Boston. Representatives from MIT leadership, the Boston Mayor's Office, and NASA attended the event, with more than two dozen local middle and high school students presenting their Day of Al projects.
